

story is told of a brilliant surgeon. It was his first time that a particular brain operation had been carried out in the country. It was performed upon a young man of great promise. It was an operation of the greatest delicacy in which a small error would have had fatal consequences. In the outcome, the operation was a triumph. But it involved several hours of intense and uninterrupted concentration on the part of the surgeon. When it was over, a nurse had to take him by the hand, and lead him from the operating theatre like a blind man or a little child.

That kind of self-giving and concentration on the needs of another reflects something of the quality of God's love in Jesus. This kind of love is sometimes beyond our comprehension. Jesus hopes that we will choose to keep on giving of ourselves in love, even when the giving hurts, even when we feel that we have nothing else to give. But it's that kind of love that mirrors God's kind of love. He loves us beyond all telling.

Some might say that this is the message we find the hardest to believe. That despite all my shortcomings and failings, there is a love that comes from God, that is unrelenting in its power. We receive this gift freely. As Jesus says, 'You did not choose me, no, I chose you.'

We are now in the heart of the Easter Season. John's Gospel presents us with a world, where the Risen Christ continues to have an impact on the lives of his followers.

A series of speeches from Jesus, with powerful sentiments, are designed to ground the disciples and the early Church in one of the most fundamental aspects of his teaching. God's love for all of humanity. When John talks about the love of God, he is clear what he means: 'This is the love I mean: not our love for God, but God's love for us.' The same message appears in the Gospel: 'You did not choose me, no, I chose you.' God has made an everlasting decision to love us. God's love is first, God has opted for us, declared his choice, taken us on. It is a decisive movement of love that began with the Father. 'As the father has loved me, so I have loved you. Remain in my love.' So here lies the task before us believers. Allowing God's love to come into our lives, to feel it, to recognise it, to believe it. These are the first steps. But now comes the challenge. We are to remain in God's love. This will mean that we too must make a choice. We choose to believe that for some reason, God has seen fit to embrace humanity, with all its shortcomings. We remain in his love. Jesus shows that he could have no greater love than to lay down his life for the sake of others. That is the powerful message of Easter.



Week of Guided Prayer, Godalming, 16 - 21 June 2024

A Week of Guided Prayer is a way of making a directed retreat in the midst of our busy lives and is often called a 'Retreat in Daily Life'. It will allow you to step away from the noise and haste of everyday life and into the quiet beauty of the Franciscan Centre.

Participants commit to spending 30 minutes each day in prayer, as well as coming to Ladywell each day to talk about their prayer experience with a trained Spiritual Director and to enjoy the wonderful grounds and prayer spaces. Your Spiritual Director will listen attentively and offer suggestions for allowing you to go deeper into your relationship with God. The 30-minute one-to-one sessions run from Monday to Friday, at a time convenient to you and your Director.

The week begins on Sunday 16 June at 2.30pm at the Franciscan Centre Ladywell, with a group session to introduce participants to the format of the week; to give some explana-

tion of praying with scripture; to spend some time in prayer together; to introduce participants to their Spiritual Director for the week; and to share some social time and light refreshments together.

On Wednesday 19 June there will be a group session at Ladywell on "Discernment" at 7.30pm.

The week ends on Friday 21 June at 7.30pm, coming together again to share our experiences and to bring the week to a prayerful close.

Pilgrimage to Walsingham—Still places available!

<u>Join us for our Parish Pilgrimage to Walsingham, the National</u> Shrine and Basilica to Our Lady on Saturday 18th May 2024.

In Celebration of Mary, on our Pilgrimage we will have the opportunity for Private Prayer in the Slipper Chapel, the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, Celebration of Confession, Attendance at the Pilgrim Mass, Praying the Rosary, and a Visit to the Holy House in Walsingham, built at Mary's request in 1049, as an exact replica of Mary's home in Nazareth when the Angel visited her, as a Perpetual Memorial of the Annunciation.

This is a Parish Event, and there will be lots of opportunities for us to come together, which is a great way for new parishioners to get to know our parish family, including our shared picnic lunch in the grounds of the Shrine, followed by an opportunity of Pray the Rosary as we Process into Walsingham.

Walsingham is 4 hours away, in Norfolk, so as part of our pilgrimage this means an early start! We will depart at 6.30am, by coach, and will have 2 comfort stops enroute. Our coach also has facilities on board. We should all bring a packed lunch, which we can leave on the coach until lunchtime. For anyone not wanting to walk in procession to Walsingham, they can be driven into Walsingham on the coach to meet us at the Holy House. We expect to return home around 8.30pm.

The cost for the day is £45.00 per adult, and £25.00 per child (under 18). This can be paid in 2 instalments, over 2 months, if helpful. We have sign-up sheets at the back of Church. Then Peter addressed them: "The truth I have now come to realise" he said, "is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him."

While Peter was still speaking the Holy Spirit came down on all the listeners. Jewish believers who had accompanied Peter were all astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit should be poured out on the pagans too, since they could hear them speaking strange languages and proclaiming the greatness of God. Peter himself then said, "Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to these people, now they have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we have?" He then gave orders for them to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ. Afterwards they begged him to stay on for some days.
