
THE WORD

Year C • 9 November 2025 • Psalter Week 4



Today is the feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica which is located in Rome. We might think that St Peter's is the pope's main church in Rome but, in fact, that distinction goes to the Basilica of St John Lateran.

St John Lateran is the pope's main church because it is the cathedral church of the Diocese of Rome, which has the pope as its bishop. It is the seat of papal authority and therefore is, in a sense, the parish church of Catholics throughout the world.

Every year, on 9 November, the anniversary of its dedication is celebrated by Catholics everywhere as a way of expressing the unity of the whole Church with the Bishop of Rome.

It is an opportunity for us to reflect on the universal nature of the Church, and what it means to be a member of it.

REFLECT

oday we celebrate the feast of the dedication of a particular church in Rome, but the readings remind us that what is really important is not bricks and mortar but rather our relationship with God and one another.

In the Gospel, Jesus drives out the money changers who had turned the Temple into a marketplace rather than a house of worship. He then refers to his own body as a sanctuary, a theme taken up by St Paul in today's second reading.

The Greek word for Church is *ekkleisia*, which means a community of believers, people who come together in faith. When St Paul tells the people at Corinth that they are God's building, he is speaking of the community that they have become. Each of them has become a new person because God's Spirit lives in and among them. They are the holy temple in whom God resides.

This is an extraordinary statement when you think about it. We are God's building. We are God's temple because God dwells in us.

This knowledge has clear implications for how we see and relate to our physical bodies, and for how we see and relate to each other. I must treat my physical body as a sacred vessel, taking good care of it, respecting and treasuring it. I must treat every person's body in the same way. Imagine how different our world would be if we all tried to do just that.

SAY

"Lord, I thank you for the gift of the ecclesial community of which I am part. Help me to do my part to build it up. Amen."

DO

Through baptism you are a member of the Church. Think about what it means for you to be a member of the Church.

LEARN

The Emperor Constantine built the Lateran Basilica in the fourth century on land that had belonged to the Laterani family (hence the name 'Lateran'). It has had a rather unfortunate history. The original building, dedicated to the Saviour, was sacked by barbarian invaders and restored in the fifth century, ruined by an earthquake in the eighth century and rebuilt in the ninth, twice burnt down in the fourteenth century and then restored. It was the residence of the popes until 1308. Pope Innocent X commissioned the present structure in 1646.


'Basilica' is the word given to an early form of building used for Christian worship. It was modelled on the Roman Basilica – a building used as a law court and a commercial exchange. At first the name was used of churches which resembled the Roman building, but now the title of 'basilica' is given by the pope to certain privileged churches both in Rome and throughout the world.

The dedication of churches can be traced back to the Jewish practice of dedicating the Temple in Jerusalem to God. Once the Temple had been dedicated, there was a feast each year to celebrate the anniversary of the dedication. This feast was celebrated not only in Jerusalem but in every synagogue as well. Similarly, every Western Catholic church observes the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome.

PRAY

Pray for our Holy Father. Ask the Lord's blessing on his ministry of leadership and service as Bishop of Rome, and our bishop, too.

Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica 9th November 2025

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

For many of us, when we think of Rome, we think of St Peter's Basilica. In a Jubilee Year such as this, the entry through the Holy Door of St Peter's is a high point of any pilgrimage. It is from the Apostolic Palace, next to St Peter's, that the Holy Father makes his Angelus addresses and it is there that the public audiences take place, as well as significant celebrations in the life of the Church: canonisations, the inaugurations of new popes and the requiem Masses for deceased popes.

Yet it is the Lateran Basilica, built originally by the Emperor Constantine, that is described as "the mother and head of all the churches of the City and the World." It is the Cathedral Church of Rome, and popes lived in the Lateran Palace for hundreds of years. It is the Pope's Cathedral, for he is the Bishop of Rome.

It is for this reason that the whole Church celebrates this feast. It is a celebration of our unity with the Holy Father, the successor of St Peter.

This Sunday's first reading, the vision of Ezekiel of the Temple in Jerusalem, speaks of the water that flows from the Temple bringing life to the desert. So it is for the Church. The waters of baptism – in which, as St Paul tells us, we die and rise with the new life of Christ – bring us to live our lives in the love that exists in the Trinity, as members of Christ's Church.

The celebration of the dedication of any Church is a reminder, as St Paul tells us in this Sunday's second reading, that the Church is made of the living stones of the baptised. We are the Church, called to reflect the wonder of the Gospel to the world around us. This is the mission that we have been given through our baptism – the mission that calls others to share in the wonder of the Church's life, the life of Christ.

The Lateran Basilica, the "mother of all the churches" stands as a witness to the world and a reminder to us, who are the living stones, of the mission to which we are called, in union with Pope Leo, the successor of Peter.

A reading from the Prophet Ezekiel.

In those days: The angel brought me back to the door of the Temple, and behold, water was issuing from below the threshold of the Temple towards the east (for the Temple faced east). The water was flowing down from below the south end of the threshold of the Temple, south of the altar. Then he brought me out by way of the north gate and led me round on the outside to the outer gate that faces towards the east; and behold, the water was trickling out on the south side. A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

The Jews then said, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this Temple, and will you raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking about the temple of his body. When therefore he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the Scripture and the word that Jesus had spoken.
